

## Fire Report – Council of Governors 16<sup>th</sup> January 2018

### Situation

This report puts into context the fire incidents recorded within NHFT and addresses concerns raised around governor awareness of fire incidents and reporting.

### Background

The Health, Safety and Risk Committee provides the Trust with an overarching view of health, safety and welfare and assurance that non-clinical risks are effectively managed on behalf of the organisation. Risks identified by the committee are highlighted in the summary report to the Quality and Governance committee.

Fire safety is a standing agenda item at the bi-monthly Health, Safety and Risk Committee with the committee monitoring and reviewing all fire safety issues. The Trust's Fire Officer provides a report giving an overview of any areas of concern for fire safety and required actions, overview of fire incidents recorded, training/fire drills undertaken and status of fire risk assessments.

### Assessment

Fire training is part of the Trust mandatory training programme for all staff. At a recent fire safety training session fire incident figures were used to underline the importance of all staff being conversant with fire safety procedures and action to take in the event of a fire. The figures quoted (17 fires in 2016) are from the information given in the staff induction booklet. These figures were taken from the fire incident data recorded in Datix for 2016 and relate to the incidents recorded under the sub-categories of actual or suspected arson and small contained fire/smouldering materials. A breakdown of those incidents is given below:

4 of the fire incidents were caused by electrical faults – 1 light fitting, 1 dishwasher, 1 wall socket and 1 overheated shredder.

1 incident occurred due to bread being left on in a toaster.

1 occurred due to smoke when clay models in the OT kitchen were put into the oven at too high a temperature.

6 incidents related to patients setting fire to something – clothes, mattress, aerosol.

5 incidents were waste bin fires in gardens/smoking related.

Appropriate action was taken in relation to these incidents with staff responding correctly by isolating power, extinguishing fire, evacuating the area and where required contacting the fire brigade - as a result minimal harm/damage occurred. 1 patient experienced smoke inhalation due to the smoke emitted when trying to set light to their jumper and another patient experienced harm not because of setting light to clothing they had removed but as a result of tampering with their central venous port valve. Staff are reminded of the importance of ongoing vigilance whilst undertaking their tasks including searches of clients and rooms to remove potential sources of ignition.

## Recommendations

Note that the ongoing programme of preventative fire safety measures including provision, checks and maintenance of fire detection systems and staff training ensures that should a fire occur the risk is mitigated appropriately to reduce the likelihood of loss/harm.
